1) Provision of a Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) at Kilham Hall Park

Confirmation has been received that Doncaster Council is in receipt of the (Section 106) funding provided by the development of the Branton House Farm site. The parish council is drawing up a specification for a MUGA and proposed plans will be available to view, and for residents to provide feedback on what sports to include and other practical aspects between 4.00 pm and 6.30 pm on 2 October 2019 at Kilham Hall Meeting Rooms. The parish council meeting will follow at 6.30 pm.

2) Storage Extension for Kilham Hall

Discussions have taken place with DMBC for any remaining Section 106 funding to be used for building a storage extension to facilitate an amount of additional outdoor equipment some of which can be used in conjunction with the MUGA. Plans are currently being finalised and a message of appreciation is extended to Saxton Design Ltd for its support with this project.

3) New Projects for Old Cantley and Bessacarr Areas of the Parish
