New Outdoor Equipment at Kilham Lane Recreation Ground

A consultation event was held on Saturday 28 January 2017 to outline proposals for a new range of outdoor equipment which includes a cable ride (zip wire), basket swing, a table tennis table, climbing wall and a range of gym apparatus (and as further funding becomes available a Multi Use Games area. Over thirty residents attended and there was overwhelming support for the proposal.

There were lots of good ideas and requests for additional equipment and these will be considered once current proposals have been finalised. The parish council will work with DMBC to progress the plans and it is aimed to complete the first phase of the project by the 2017 school summer holiday period. 2017/18 Precept – Annual Review from 1 April 2017

After careful consideration the parish council determined that the 2017/18 precept should not be increased significantly and therefore the average increase (for a Band 'D' property) will be 0.04% giving annual rise of £0.01. The total revenue raised will be £32,600 due to an increase in the number of properties paying the precept.

Many residents will be aware that Star (a young Alsatian) went missing recently and was found after six nights and reunited with her worried owners, fortunately no worse for her ordeal. Many people joined in the search for her demonstrating the wonderful community spirit that exists in the parish and surrounding area.
